Food Systems Policy Tool - A tool to help governments deliver healthier diets and sustainable food systems

The Global Panel on Agriculture and Food Systems for Nutrition has developed a Food Systems Policy Tool to support the delivery of national nutrition strategies. It is designed to help bridge the policy gap between those who create food, nutrition and agricultural policies and those responsible for implementing those policies.

The tool addresses malnutrition in all its forms in the broader context of climate change, environmental deterioration, human health and diet quality, and aims to support the implementation of integrated national strategies on the ground.

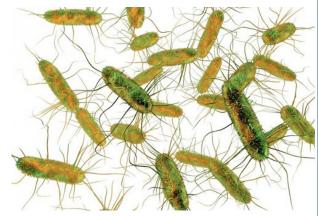
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# EU One Health report: drop in reported zoonotic diseases in humans and foodborne outbreaks in 2020

Campylobacteriosis was the most reported zoonosis in the EU in 2020, with 120,946 cases compared to more than 220,000 the previous year. It was followed by salmonellosis, which affected 52,702 people compared to 88,000 in 2019. The number of reported foodborne outbreaks also fell by 47%. These findings are based on the annual EU One Health zoonosis report, by EFSA and ECDC.

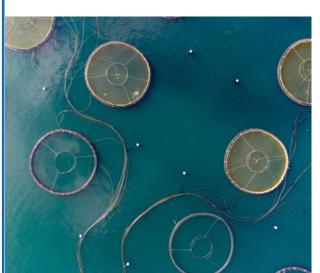
Experts acknowledged the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic in Europe in the remarkable drop in reported zoonotic diseases in humans – ranging from 7% to 53% depending on the reported disease in question - and foodborne outbreaks.

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# EIT Food celebrates sustainable aquaculture innovations to address UN SDGs at Showcase event

It is clear that aquaculture is a key food system in addressing several of the UN targets around the ocean, land, climate change, sustainable consumption and production, but always with a strong drive to end hunger and poverty. As highlighted at the 2021 UN Food Systems Summit, there is a greater understanding of how sustainable seafood can meaningfully contribute to and be at the heart of global food systems.

At the EIT Food Aquaculture Showcase event, 12 EIT Food partners presented their aquaculture projects which are transforming aquatic farming into a more sustainable, profitable and efficient sector.



#### Sustainable food systems through diversity?

ERA-NETs SUSFOOD2 and CORE Organic have published the first results of the joint call "Towards sustainable and organic food systems".

The focus on "food systems" was a starting point for the collaboration, which recognised the mutual applicability of different scientific solutions relevant to both sustainable and organic food sectors. 12 scientific projects were selected and their initial research results are now presented. Topics such as the role of diversity in sustainable food systems, sustainable and organic production of alfalfa, wine and meat, innovations in mild/minimal food processing, the use of food industry by-products as well as learnings from organic and sustainable frontrunners in the European food production are addressed.
